LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES


Quarterly online and self-guided educational sessions coordinated by the *Vascular Medicine* editorial office to review specific aspects of peer review, editing and publishing manuscripts, and working with an international publishing house. Participants will learn about mechanisms for content dissemination, publication metrics, and publication ethics.

Participate in twice yearly meetings of the *Vascular Medicine* Editorial Board (in person or via webinar) and be listed as a member of the Editorial Board in print and online versions of *Vascular Medicine*.

Develop skills in peer review, content development and dissemination, and writing editorials.

Work with special section editors to develop materials for journal-related CME, disseminate journal content via social media platforms, and develop patient information materials.

Opportunity to work with Editorial Office on development of a focused issue topic and call for papers.



Vascular Medicine is offering an opportunity to learn about the medical publishing process and develop skills in peer review and editing while contributing to the official journal of the Society for Vascular Medicine.

Commitments as a member of the Next Generation Editorial Board include:

- 3-year term
- Peer review of up to six manuscripts per year for the journal, with incorporation of feedback from the editors.
- Write at least one editorial, with mentorship of the Editor-in-Chief or Associate Editor.
- Serve as an ambassador for *Vascular Medicine* by considering the journal for submission of your own scientific manuscripts and reviews and encouraging colleagues in your field to submit scientific articles to the journal for peer review.

- Early career individuals either currently in training or within 5 years of terminal training are encouraged to apply.
- Applicants with career focus in the field of vascular medicine and/or vascular biology and members of the Society for Vascular Medicine (including Associate Members) will be given preference for this opportunity.
