

VMJ CALL FOR VASCULAR ONCOLOGY PAPERS

CALL FOR PAPERS:

Focused Issue on Vascular Oncology

Vascular Medicine is currently soliciting manuscripts for a Focused Issue devoted to vascular disease manifestations and treatment in patients with cancer as well as vascular complications of cancer treatment. Original research, reviews, research letters, and clinical images will be considered.

Deadline for Submissions is August 30, 2019.

Topics for consideration include:

- Natural history or management of specific vascular disorders among patients with cancer
- Peripheral vascular effects and toxicities of cancer therapies (e.g., chemotherapy, targeted immunotherapy, cellular therapies), including mechanistic studies
- Vascular effects of radiation therapy
- Subset analyses of clinical trials of anticoagulation management for venous thromboembolism among patients with cancer
- · Vascular outcomes among cancer survivors during longitudinal follow-up
- Cancer risk of repeated exposure to imaging studies for surveillance of vascular disease
- Interventional therapies to treat cancer-related vascular complications including pulmonary embolism, deep venous thrombosis, and arterial or venous compression syndromes.

Manuscripts must be prepared according to the submission guidelines and submitted online by the deadline through the journal's website: http://journals.sagepub.com/home/vmj. Please choose 'Focused Issue – Vascular Oncology' as the article type.
