IN MEMORIAM

SVM mourns the passing of one of its longstanding fellows, Dr. Leslie Gilbert. Dr. Gilbert trained in internal medicine and vascular medicine at Cleveland Clinic, finishing her vascular medicine training in 1993. Prior to joining the staff of Cleveland Clinic in 2008, Dr. Gilbert had built a large solo practice in vascular medicine at St. Vincent's Hospital, and she was a highly respected physician throughout the city of Cleveland.

Dr. Gilbert was a master clinician in vascular medicine with a particular passion for the care of patients with lymphedema and wound care and for

the Non-Invasive Vascular Laboratory. In her decade on staff at the Cleveland Clinic, she was instrumental in growing the regional presence of vascular medicine throughout the Cleveland area and was a beloved educator of our fellows.

Her colleagues and former trainees at Cleveland Clinic will always remember Dr. Gilbert as an astute, compassionate clinician and a tireless champion for improving care for all patients with vascular disease. From Dr. Heather Gornik: "We will always remember Leslie for her love of teaching and spreading the gospel of vascular medicine. Her vascular lab reading sessions were the stuff of legend for our fellows (...and watch out if you didn't know the various diagnostic criteria!). She took genuine pleasure in her interactions with her patients and her colleagues and truly embraced collaboration with all caregivers on the team, especially our vascular technologists. She loved discussing tricky cases with our techs and working together as a team to use vascular lab tools to make a difficult diagnosis. In acknowledgment of her tremendous collaboration in the vascular lab, she served as the chief judge for the lab's annual case club competition each year. We will remember and always be inspired by Leslie's courage and tenacity in a battling illness and the kindness and humanity with which she approached all of her patients as well as her partners and friends here in vascular medicine."
